## Course description – Including aims & objectives

This basic computer skills course will allow learners to gain the skills and confidence to take advantage of computers and the internet. Learners will become computer literate in this hands-on course while learning to use the internet more effectively. The aim is to demystify terminology and impart best practice skills for productive and secure use of computers and the internet. Learners will be asked to complete a Needs Assessment form to help assess and identify current skill levels, expectations, and specific goals as an aid in course curriculum development. Examples of basic computer skills to include:

- Starting and shutting down your computer.
- Navigating the operating system and start applications.
- Using the keyboard and mouse
- Computer security best practice

Examples of Internet skills and knowledge to include:

- Sending and receiving email
- Internet security best practice
- How to get around on the internet using a browser
- Searching on the internet
- Downloading files from the internet
- Knowledge of some of the most common uses of the internet: shopping, banking, social media, access to public services, phone applications (e.g. Skype).

The Learning Outcomes will be achieved through a mix of demonstrations, discussions, and interactive exercises.

Each learner will successfully perform the practical learning outcomes to include specific goals as described in the Needs Assessment form.
