Create beautiful items to keep or give to Family and Friends.

It will give a taste of what can be achieved in papercraft and I hope it will spark your imagination as you enjoy this creative day.

On arrival you will be given a goodie bag containing products to make the projects you can take any contents home at the end of the day to add to your stash.

4 project tables will be set up, and on each table will be the Tools and Materials to create the Projects.

Up to 4 items can be produced at each table.

These will include Cards, Gift tags, and Boxes.

You will move from table to table creating a range of linked and co-ordinated projects.

Tea and coffee will be available throughout the day, but you will need to bring your own packed lunch.
