BTEC Level 2 Technical Diploma for Sport and Activity Leaders

WHY SHOULD I CHOOSE THIS STUDY PROGRAMME?

The qualification gives you the knowledge, understanding and skills required for a career in sport and physical activity, leading onto employment, apprenticeships or further study. The course involves many practical elements, developing key skills and leadership practice, all underpinned from knowledge developed.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

You will study six mandatory content areas:

- Leading Sport Safely and Effectively
- Working in Sport and Activity Leadership
- Leading Sport and Physical Activity
- Coaching Sport
- Developing Skills for Sport and Activity Leadership
- Delivering a Sports Activity Event

And one optional content area (to be decided by centre)

- Getting Others Active Outdoors
- Leading Different Groups

WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

This qualification is primarily designed to support students entering Post-16 education, who need to study on a Level 2 course. It will run in conjunction with re-sit English and maths, as well as other supporting Level 2 courses. The course is a programme of study for one year, which can lead to apprenticeships, employment or further study at Level 3.



WHAT WILL BE EXPECTED OF ME?

- Participate in practical lessons
- To lead sessions to peers and younger children
- Read and research key topic areas, both in and out of lesson
- Keep a record of the information you find and the sources
- Plan your work in a logical order and keep a record of your progress
- Work with peers and your teacher to talk about your ideas
- Strive to achieve the best results
- Produce drafts and final copies of your work
- Produce good quality work with high standards of grammar and spelling
- Present your work in a suitable format according to the purpose and the audience
- Evaluate your work, whether it be written or practical, and make suggestions for improvement
- Meet deadlines continuously
- Keep a record of the work you have completed, including the grades and points you have been awarded

WHO WILL BE INVOLVED?

The subject teachers are responsible for planning lessons, preparing resources, assessing work and making sure that the units are completed on time.

FURTHER INFORMATION

How will you be assessed?

Units are assessed using a grading scale of Distinction, Merit, Pass and Unclassified. All mandatory and optional units contribute proportionately to the overall qualification grade, for example a unit of 60 GLH will contribute double that of a 30 GLH unit.

To achieve any qualification grade, learners must:

- Complete and have an outcome (D, M P or U) for all units within a valid combination
- Achieve the required units at pass or above (Units 1,2,3,4,5,6).
- Achieve the minimum number of points at a grade threshold

Qualifications are graded using a scale of PP to DD. Depending on total points scored across the course of the year.
