WHY SHOULD I CHOOSE THIS STUDY PROGRAMME?

The Level 3 Performing Arts course offers a wide range of units to reflect the range of opportunities available within the Performing Arts sector. It is an ideal foundation for students interested in a career in the Performing Arts, preparing you for the modern demands of the acting industry, enabling you to be flexible and adaptive. You will learn how to develop your acting techniques and your performance skills. There are also opportunities to learn about script writing and an introduction to Theatre Directing. You will practically apply your skills and knowledge in preparation for further study or the workplace. You will gain a range of transferable skills that will underpin freelance work in your chosen field.

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WHAT WILL BE EXPECTED OF ME?

To excel in the diploma, you should have a strong interest in drama and basic experience of performing, although it is not necessary for you have to have taken the subject at GCSE level. It is recommended that you have, or are working towards, a grade 4 in Maths and English.

Full commitment to attendance is required. Respect for others, enthusiasm for the subject and self-motivation along with creative ability and a desire to succeed are essential qualities we expect to see in all our learners.
